Symposium Leaders and Speakers

Dr Jane Wray is a Senior Lecturer in Nursing at the Faculty of Health Sciences at the University of Hull, and England's Senior Clinical Nurse Advisor for the National Preceptorship Programme.

She is currently leading the national work on Preceptorship, co-authoring the new National Framework for Preceptorship in England and developing resources to support organisations to provide a high quality, consistent preceptorship experience for new registrants.

She is also a registered nurse and teaches and supervises students at undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD level. Jane has an established track record in research, scholarship, teaching and learning and public engagement. She is Deputy Editor for Evidence Based Nursing (BMJ) and on the International Advisory Board for Frontiers of Nursing (Sienda).

Rachelle Alty has been a registered adult nurse for twelve years, commencing her career in emergency care. From here, she became a qualified teacher and has gained experience working in Further Education and Clinical Education, before being appointed as Head of Professional Practice Development for Nursing and Midwifery at Southport & Ormskirk NHS Trust.

In addition to this role, Rachelle also works at NHS England as the Northwest regional lead for the National Preceptorship Programme for Nursing, championing the delivery of regional and national agendas aimed at supporting and developing early career professionals. Rachelle is a practicing career coach and mentor, and completed a Masters degree in Coaching and Mentoring in 2021.

This has led to a Professional Doctorate in Coaching and Mentoring at the International Centre for Coaching and Mentoring Studies at Oxford Brookes University.

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
