### **Countdown to regulation**

October

- Update for system leaders <u>published on website</u>
- Information will be sent to employers about supporting you with registration

November

- Email PAs on the MVR to outline what to expect and registration approach
- GMC finalising rules and processes needed to begin regulation

December


- We'll publish our consultation analysis report
- Friday 13 Dec: GMC Council empowered to make rules
- Monday 16 Dec: Registration will open but not until January for most

### Our messages for PAs

- If you were on the PAMVR on 13 December, we will email you directly in January 2025, inviting you to apply for registration
- In advance, we're going to:

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- allocate you a GMC number
- set up a GMC Online account for you
- pre-populate your account with verified information about your PA qualification and PANE pass



- Waiting for your personal invitation in January will be the quickest way to get onto the register
- Invites will go out in batches during January, so don't worry if a colleague gets theirs before you.
- Please don't try to create your own GMC account via our website because it won't speed things
  up for you
- If you haven't heard from us by the end of January 2025, <u>let us know</u>
- If you were not on the PAMVR on 13 December, you'll need to apply to us directly via our website and we'll need to verify your details once you apply.

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### Messaging for employers

- Any PAs you employ on the MVR will be invited to apply by end of January 2025. They should wait
  for their invite before applying.
- If you employ PAs not on the MVR, they will **need to apply via the GMC website** from 16 December although there are additional steps so this will take longer.
- All PAs will need to provide an employer reference as part of their application. This should be completed by their clinical supervisor.
- All PAs will also need to confirm they have adequate insurance and indemnity arrangements in place.
- You may require PAs to be on either the MVR or our register. RCP will maintain a static version of the MVR until 31 March 2025 to give PAs time to apply.
- After the two-year transition period, from December 2026 it will become an offence to practise as
  a PA without GMC registration.
- Please be ready to support your PAs with their application and encourage them to apply promptly.

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## Appraisal and (future) revalidation

#### **Appraisal**

- PAs should already be having annual appraisals
- Appraisal is an employerowned process
- We recommend PAs become familiar with <u>our guidance on</u> <u>appraisal for revalidation</u> and start recording examples
- Employers should follow our guidance <u>Effective clinical</u> <u>governance to support</u> <u>revalidation</u>
- We won't specify how PAs should record appraisal or what CPD they should do

#### Revalidation

- Revalidation is a GMC process which is based on regular appraisal plus a periodic recommendation from the employer
- It will provide assurance that a PA's skills are up to date and they are fit to practise
- It won't start for PAs and AAs until after end of transition period
- We'll consult on this after regulation starts
